PUBLIC INFO & MEETINGS



Sheriff Edward N. Bonner releases the following information:

The Placer County Sheriff's Office and Placer County Parking Enforcement would like to remind residents and tourists coming to the North Lake Tahoe area about Snow Parking.

Placer County Code §10.12.02 B. states "it is unlawful to park on any public roadway, or on the shoulders of the roadway, ..., during the period commencing November 1st of the year and continuing to the following May 1st, except in areas specifically designated by signs to permit such parking.

Another Placer County Code to consider is PCC § 10.12.030 B which is "parked on a roadway, blocking plow or emergency equipment," is unlawful.

If your vehicle is parked on the roadway during November 1st to May 1st, your vehicle may be cited and/or towed by the Placer County Sheriff's Office, Placer County Parking Enforcement or the California Highway Patrol. The snowstakes installed on the highway serve as a guide for Cal-Trans snow removal and not as a guideline for vehicles to park on the shoulder. This Placer County Code is in effect whether snow is on the roadway or not.

Free Ski Shuttle Perfect for the Eco-Conscious Traveler

Those who have experienced peak-season traffic jams while trying to navigate certain stretches of Truckee and North Tahoe roadways en route to or from a day on the slopes have a new transportation option to consider. The **Truckee-Tahoe Free Ski Shuttle** which will provide service on **Martin Luther King, Jr. weekend, January 14-16.**

The Truckee-Tahoe Free Ski Shuttle will take skiers from Truckee to Northstar California or Squaw Valley and back again at the end of the day. **Two park 'n ride lots will be offered**— one at Truckee High School and one at the Truckee Tahoe Airport.

 The free shuttle offers **savings on gas** and provides an **eco-friendly mode of travel**. By riding the shuttle, users will be helping to put fewer cars on the road, enabling a faster ride to the mountain for everyone.

Added Bonuses of the Shuttle:

1. Be dropped off right at the village, eliminating any long walks
2. Let a professional driver worry about road conditions and traffic, so you are free to visit, surf the web or text
3. Meet new skier and rider friends
4. Receive a **"goodie bag"** stuffed with savings redeemable at local businesses

The park 'n ride parking lots are located at the Truckee High School (11725 Donner Pass Road) and at the Truckee Tahoe Airport (10356 Truckee Airport Road).

The Truckee-Tahoe Free Ski Shuttle is a collaborative program provided by Northstar California, Squaw Valley, Alpine Meadows Ski Resort, Sugar Bowl Resort, Tahoe Donner Association, North Lake Tahoe Chamber/CVB/Resort Association, Truckee Donner Chamber of Commerce, Town of Truckee, Truckee North Tahoe Transportation Management Association and the Tahoe Truckee Unified School District.
